Summer is in full swing and we have been busy. In June, we participated in Williams' Aiming to Make Changes Archery & Clay Shoot and raised just over \$14,000 in support of our community partners and United Way programs. We followed that by providing vaccine hesitancy information at the second annual Juneteenth Celebration in Brandon Park. Several people got COVID-19 vaccinations because of this outreach and we enjoyed interacting with the community.

In July, we conducted our Day of Action at Sojourner Truth Ministries, and with our friends from Baker Tilly, we were able to hand insulation for an entire first floor and paint a railing. We also attended the United Way of Pennsylvania State Conference in State College and got an opportunity to interact with United Way leaders across the Commonwealth. The expense of the conference was covered by flexible professional development credits provided by United Way Worldwide.

On July 17, we got the opportunity to participate with Williamsport Police Chief Justin Snyder, Assistant Chief Jason Bolt, and Mayor Slaughter at Cookin' Up Conversations with Cops at City Church. In addition, because of our relationship with Cummins Sales & Service in Williamsport, we were able to provide four brand new bikes to kids at the event after a successful Safe Kids Bike Rodeo the previous Friday at Memorial Park. Don Musser and his team at Cummins are providing our United Way with 30 unisex bikes, helmets, and locks as part of a global relationship with United Way Worldwide. In addition to these events, we also had bikes available at the annual Kids Carnival, presented by the Brickyard Restaurant & Ale House and The Stonehouse Wood Fired Pizza & Pasteria during Kids First Friday on August 5. We will end the summer with summer reading at the Hughesville and Montgomery Public Libraries and with our campaign kickoff on September 1 with our friends at New Trail Brewing.

We are grateful for the outpouring of support from our community business partners and for the countless volunteers who helped us with our Day of Action and Kids Carnival.

Our annual grant-making process wrapped in May and the Board approved the community's recommendations as part of our annual budget in July. Look for more on this impact in the coming months.

Volunteer Recruitment Program:

Susquehanna Valley CASA - Voices for Children employs a full-time case manager to oversee up to 30 cases or up to 45 children in the child welfare/Dependency Program. The case manager is responsible for overseeing the 30 volunteers recruited and trained to be advocates for these children through the Volunteer Recruitment Program. Volunteers are



thoroughly trained and managed by the case manager to consistently advocate for the child/sibling group while their case is active in the Dependency court system.
