Vaccinations are rolling out locally as quickly as possible, but we still have supply challenges and weather events that seem to get in the way. Please be patient and recognize that our healthcare systems and others are working hard to get vaccinations into people's arms. PA 211 Northeast is a program of the Family Service Association of NEPA's Help Line. 211 in Lycoming County is funded by our United Way.

In March we celebrate Jersey Mike's Month and Day of Giving and our participation in the First Community Foundation Partnership of Pennsylvania (FCFP) Raise the Region on March 10-11. ### Did you know?

- The IRS allows you to satisfy part or all of your IRA's Required Minimum
  Distribution (RMD) requirement by contributing directly to a 501c (3) charitable
  organization. The check must be made out directly to the charity by the
  trustee. When done properly, the distribution is not taxable to the IRA owner and
  counts toward the (RMD) Required Minimum Distribution.
- Although the CARES Act temporarily extended the age to start RMD's to 72, the
  qualified charitable distribution was not changed. You may contribute directly to
  your charity from your IRA up to 100,000 per person per year, even if it exceeds
  what your actual RMD is.
- With the new higher standard deduction, passed in the 2017 Tax Act, it makes sense for a lot of taxpayers to donate to charitable causes as every American has an above the line deduction without incurring tax liability.

American Rescue Workers (ARW) is a faith based non-profit organization providing homelessness and hunger prevention services in Lycoming County since 1934.



ARW aims to meet the basic needs of men, women, and children who find

themselves in an emergency situation or a homeless crisis by providing material and spiritual aid through shelter programs and social services.

The Lycoming County funds two programs at the ARW:

- CEAP Program
  - The American Rescue Workers, CEAP program offers assistance in an emergent situation. These individuals who are requesting assistance have exhausted all other resources. They provide immediate needs related to hunger, homelessness, medical concerns, and other emergency issues that threaten the safety and well-being of Lycoming County residents.
- Saving Grace Shelter
  - Saving Grace is a 24 bed family day-to-day emergency shelter on the corner of Grace and Campbell Streets in Williamsport. Saving Grace is the only true family emergency shelter in Lycoming County. While staying at Saving Grace, residents are required to set housing goals with the case manager and work on those goals daily to obtain affordable, permanent housing.



Investing \$52 right now provides 260 pounds of canned food for American Rescue Workers to distribute to food-insecure families.
